Vega agrees with Campbell. After initial cooking classes were conducted with the public, one of the most common complaints about barbecuing with other grills was the fact that they were so difficult to clean. The e-series however, are very easy to clean.

Another boon of the eBQs is the way in which they optimise space, the e7 allows grillers to use a wok to construct some of their favourite Asian dishes, or cook pizzas, just like a pizzaiolo. In many ways, the e-series barbecues are superior to conventional kitchens. Even the smaller barbecue, the e2, offers fat drainage and halogen lights.
